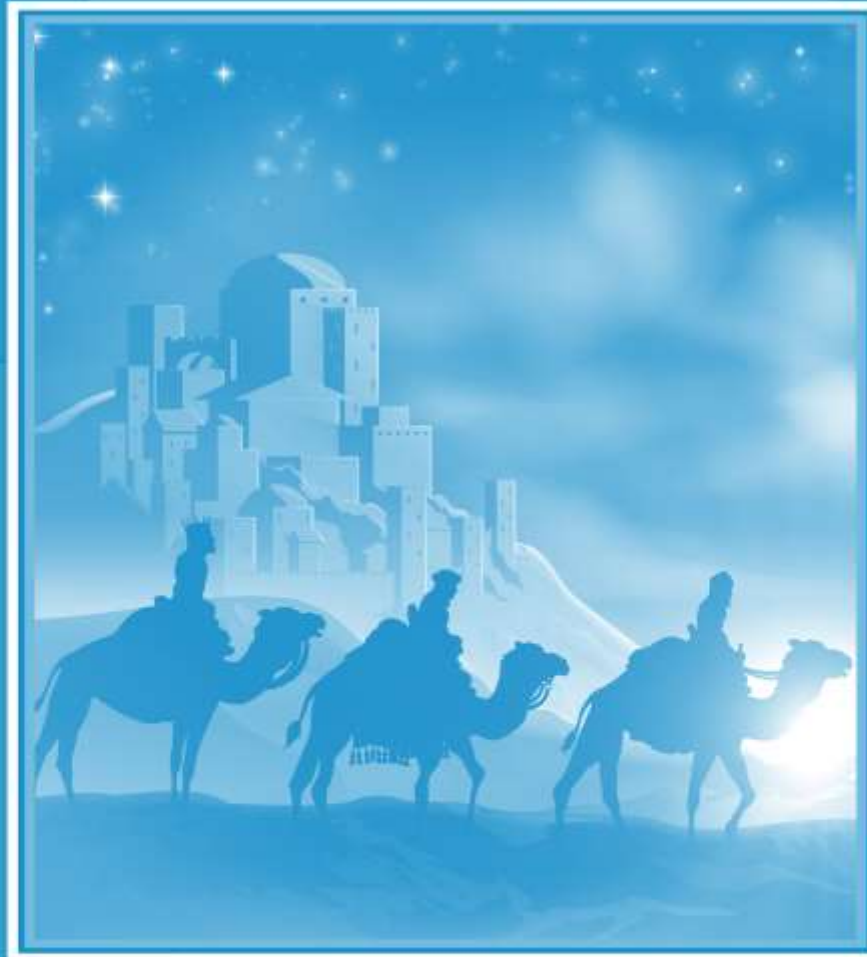

### **Confession Tip #4: Name Your Sins**

Last week we talked about being prepared for our confessions. This is good. We should be ready to name all our sins (no holding anything back), how many times we did them (even if just a ballpark), and put it all in the past. But sometimes, people are tempted to decorate their sins with fancy language. Instead of naming the thing, folks can be tempted to dance around it, or cloak it in language that is very vague. Saying "I slipped in charity" could mean almost anything—gossip, hitting, anger, and so on. There is something liberating about utter honesty. "This is my life. I am in need of a savior." It is good to name the thing, own it, and say, "I messed up and don't want to do that anymore."

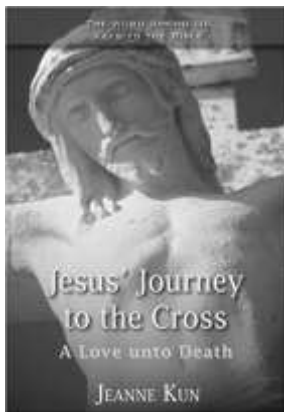

## St. Joseph History Celebrating the

## Joy of God's Blessings in Shelby County Since 1828

The first Catholic priest to set foot on Shelby County soil did so in 1828, six years after the county was organized in 1822. Rev. Father George Elder delivered the first Catholic sermon in a schoolhouse in Shelbyville. The first Catholic, however Mrs. Mary Cornell, came to Shelby County in 1824. The second Catholic immigrants, Mr. and Mrs. Leo H. Worland, came in 1825 from Scott County, Kentucky. At that time, churchgoers gathered in private homes and public halls for services. It was not until 1839 that the first Catholic Church was built in Shelby County at St. Vincent's by Rev. Father Baqualin. Pastors of St. Vincent's Church, primarily the Rev. John P Gillig, attended to Catholics in Shelbyville until 1886 when the congregation received its own Pastor, Rev. Adelrich Kaelin. Father Gillig purchased a lot on East Broadway Street in Shelbyville in 1864 where the first brick church was built. ---Information from Father Adelrich Kaelin's yearbook of 1903.
