

Maybe the best way to organize all this is by dates! Here's some things going on around here:

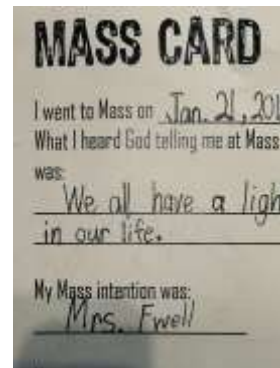
- **January 28** — Happy birthday Fr. Paul! What a blessing Fr. Paul is for us here in Shelby County. I am so thankful for all his help and for his holy example and friendship.
- **January 28 – February 3** - Catholic Schools Week! I love Catholic schools! Say a prayer for our school—may we always grow in holiness and in number!!
- **February 2** – First Friday. Adoration starts at 9am Friday and ends 9am Saturday. A Mass on Friday for the Sacred Heart will be at 6pm, with the First Friday devotions and confessions following.
- **February 3** – Family Faith Formation weekend
- **February 3 & 4** – The Little Sisters of the Poor are coming to speak briefly at all Masses. These Sisters do so much good for the Church, especially in taking care of the elderly. I love this about them: they make the normal vows of chastity, poverty, and obedience, but they also make a vow of hospitality. I think that is wonderful. Let's greet the Sisters next week with open arms!!
- **February 8** – Fr. Aaron Pfaff's birthday! I continue to give thanks for all of my predecessors here...such holy men! Fr. Aaron's holiness and humility is an inspiration for me and I'm so thankful for his friendship.
- **February 14** – Ash Wednesday. Masses at St. Joe: 7:15am, 8:15am school, Noon Service (no Mass), and 7pm. St. Vincent's Mass is 6:00pm.

- **March 17** – Oldenburg Holy Sites/Shrines Pilgrimage – Leave at 9am and back by 4pm I know I'm forgetting things, more coming!

St. Joseph 150th History

St. Joseph Schools Date Back to 1873

Sixty children attended the first school that St. Joseph's parish opened in the fall of 1873 through the guidance of Father Francis Rudolph of St. Vincent's Church. Three Sisters of St. Francis provided instruction to the children in two classrooms. The school facility was expanded with a move in 1898 to a house that faced Hendricks Street. Another move occurred in June 1902 to make room for a larger church building. St. Joseph's first resident pastor, the Rev. Alderich Kaelin, had the old church remodeled into three rooms and classes opened there on Sept. 12, 1904.

In the spring of 1922, Father John C. Rager was appointed pastor and his task was to fulfill "an urgent need for a new building". Two properties were purchased the next year at a cost of \$7,500 with John Hagel of Indianapolis hired as the new architect. Hagel drew plans that included a parish auditorium, a Sisters dwelling, and a social center. Entry would also be constructed from the school basement to the church basement without going outside to get from one building to the next.

Ground was broken for the new school on St. Joseph's Feast Day, March 19, 1924. Parishioners had the idea to include a high school. It had its trial run in 1922 successfully. The first graduation class was in 1926: Alfred York, Urban Soller, Emerson Dellekamp, Charles Slifer, Martha Ford, Vitalis Dellekamp and Irene Caroon. There was a high school basketball team that had few wins until Nate Kaufman started coaching. The team won a championship in 1926 and was invited to the National Tournament at DePauw University in Chicago. The team won 17 of 22 games that year and the following year, but lost in the play-off games.

Salvation Army Dinner

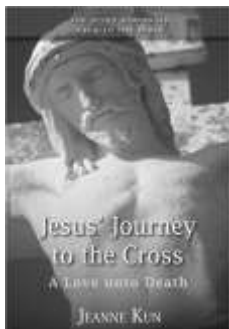
