

It's time to count some graces -





# Sr. Joan's Corner

Dear Parishioners.

The Gospel declares that, "Jesus loved Martha and Mary her sister and their brother Lazarus." This statement tells us so much about Jesus and his personal friendships. But it also makes us wonder why Jesus did not go when he received word about Lazarus' illness. He was only a short distance away. His reason, "This illness is not going to end in death." But, Lazarus did die! And after four days Jesus arrived at Bethany. Mary and Martha were grieved and disappointed in Jesus. "If you had been here, my brother would not have died!" When Jesus saw Mary's tears, the Gospel says, "Jesus wept." This reaction makes us wonder even more, why didn't he come sooner? He loved Martha, Mary and Lazarus. Why didn't he come and cure him before he died? I think many of us ask God some form of this same question when a loved one dies. Jesus answered that question when he called Lazarus forth from the tomb. Life came from death. It is as if Jesus says to us, you always think of love as what you have because you have life. But the opposite is true. Life is something you can have only because you are rooted in love. Death does not erase love, it brings you more deeply back into it, to the place you came from—from love. Pray about this. Jesus says, that is the reason I delayed going to Bethany.
