From the Desk of Fr. Mike

Dear Friends.

Last week, we welcomed Fr. Bala who came to us from India on behalf of the Sisters of the Holy Spirit. It was kind of funny. After he landed in the airport, he called us to see about his accommodations. None of us at St. Joe's or St. Vincent's knew he was coming! My best guess is that Fr. Some things coming up:




