Lots to tell you about!!!

Old Palms: Ash Wednesday is right around the corner (Feb. 14). In the coming weekends, please place your old palms in the depository in the narthex. As you know, I'm blessed to be the religion teacher for our fourth and fifth graders at St. Joe School—which I love! I will be showing the students how to make ashes with old palms...it is so fun!!

Old Blessed Stuff Other Than Palms: There will also be a depository for other blessed things that are broken or past their useful lives. As you know, such things cannot be thrown away since they have been blessed and are therefore sacred. I will burn all that stuff in a separate place from the palms. Put anything in there. I know how to make a good fire that will eat almost anything!!

Server Training: We are blessed with many servers! Youth who currently serve or who wish to start serving at St. Joe's (fourth grade and up) should all plan to attend a server training workshop. Two are being offered: Jan. 23rd at 3 p.m. or Jan. 24th at 5 p.m. Come to one or both! If neither time works, please talk with Fr. Mike. We will start having a schedule again next month. I tried without it and it didn't work as well as I had hoped.

Catholic Schools Week: I am SUPER excited for our upcoming Catholic Schools Week! We are so blessed by our school. We have a school because the Church is the Body of Jesus, and just as Jesus taught his faithful when he was walking around as one of us, he continues to teach through Body the Church! This is why we have such a massive Catholic school system in our Church. Catholic Schools Week is a great time to celebrate and rededicate our school. If you have a child between preschool and fifth grade not at St. Joe's, consider it. There are a lot of resources available to help afford it. Every day I talk with our kids and witness their enthusiasm and zest for the faith. I cannot imagine the Church without our schools. We will kick off our Catholic Schools Week celebration with Holy Mass at 10:30 a.m. on Sunday, January 28th. Let us pray for our beautiful school!

Faith Formation Commission: I recently attended a meeting put on by the Office of Catechesis in the Archdiocese. They informed all of us priests, deacons and directors of religious education that we must have faith formation commissions. These commissions are supposed to evaluate EVERY YEAR the faith formation programs a parish offers. The reality is, faith formation is about the most important thing we do here, aside from the sacraments! It is critical that we do it well. Faith formation is for everyone—babies through the more seasoned crowd. This commission is meant to see what we are doing, evaluate how well are we doing it, and figure out how to improve things and begin doing things we should do but aren't yet doing. We have several youth on the commission. We also have parents with newborns, parents with kids in school and in Sunday program or Family Faith Formation, and adults of all ages. I can't wait to see how the Holy Spirit works through this commission to help enhance our faith formation initiatives.

Choir: We need more people in the choir! Aaron is doing a phenomenal job with our choir and music here at St. Joe's. I love hearing all the compliments about our music here these days; I am so thankful. Aaron is incredibly gifted in helping to shape our worship to the Lord at Holy Mass. The Demands of Discipleship

Today we encounter readings that already have a Lenten feel about them. Nineveh undergoes a forty-day fast, the psalmist reminds us that God alone can show sinners the way, Paul shows us how fleeting the things and events of this world are, and Jesus cries out "Repent!" before he calls his new followers. "Come after me," Jesus says, but if we are to truly live out the commands and demands of our discipleship through baptism, we must first know our need for conversion, our repentance, our need to believe in the gospel fully. Today's Gospel opens with the stark reminder of what befell John the Baptist for completely living out his vocation as the herald of Christ and the gospel: he was arrested, imprisoned, and martyred. Though few of us will experience consequences that extreme, we must all be ready to risk some sort of rejection as, heeding the call of Jesus, we live out the kingdom of God at hand, repent of our sins, and believe in the good news of salvation.

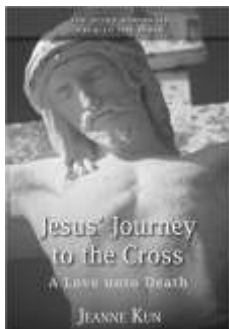

St. Joseph 150th History

Growth Continues with St. Joseph's Prompting Changes in the Late 1800s

- 1873: The first parochial school was opened.
- 1890-91: Additions were built to the church, school and priest's house.
- 1895: On the eve of All Saints, the deed was signed for the purchase of the new cemetery adjoining Forest Hill at the edge of Shelbyville.
- 1902: In June, Retired Rev. Bishop Chatard approved designs and plans for a new church. Ground was broken on Sept. 8, 1902.
- Oct. 1902-Feb. 1903: Stone work for the foundation was laid. Construction contracts were signed in April, 1903.
- Summer, 1904: Rev. Anthony Scheideler blessed the basement room for divine services. Holy Mass was offered for the first time the morning of July 8, 1904, a Saturday.
- 1906: Plans were made for completion of the church. Parishioners gave \$6,000 for completion of the interior after Mass on Oct. 20, 1907.
- Aug. 2, 1908: The new church was dedicated. Total cost, including furnishings, except for the organ, was \$59,970.56.

Rockport Mission

*As the hurricane churned above our heads,
we raised our cries toward heaven, voices
stifled in that tortured sky, caught
by an August beast with lion-like claws.
It swallowed our pleas, slashed our roofs and siding,
tore through walls, uprooted lives.
The surge swept destruction with unrelenting measure--
family mementos morphed to rain-soaked debris--
treasures scattered, memories destroyed.*

*But this morning bright voices hover around us--
low, multisyllabic sounds scudding across
sand and grass only to engage our greatest sorrows,
gather them up, feel them deeply as if their own,
voices that are coffee-rich and warm on a cool Texas day,
layered with softness, fur-lined, to relieve
the bone-chilling shocks of loss.*

*When we first returned to the ravaged edges of the storm,
our hearts tore from their moorings, hope turned tissue-thin
upon shoals of desolation and despair.
But as their voices traversed a continent-- ferried by psalms
of support and prayers--- Light was cast over
darkening tides, Spirit rose higher than the towers of debris.
And side by side, with saws and hammers,
roofs were repaired; debris removed, walls restored,
and Grace poured out both from us and around us-*

*souls imbued with the Bread of Life, the Christ,
most precious-- found in the clasp of a gentle embrace,
through sacrificial wine - our Lord, who, through loss,
became both human and divine.
And our Vietnamese hymns rang bell-like and clear,
paired with their resonate English--
a Holy Harmony blended in praise and thanksgiving
away from the haunting rubble of our sanctuary--*

*its steel girders rent and maimed, blessed glass
gouged out and shattered--
but where our sacred alter remains unscathed,
our Cross towers as the unblemished promise of resurrection,
and the ambo whispers 'good news' for all to hear--
Light will flood the darkness,
Love spreads beyond all bounds, that "all of us, though
there are many..., make up one body in Christ..."
and together we sang
"Hosanna in the Highest, Blessed is he..."*
