I like to start the Lenten season each year with my annual retreat. Church law requires every priest to take an annual retreat, to plug into the Lord and unplug from all the distractions. I think this is good practice for everyone. It is never easy to be away for a week, but spending that time with the Lord is well worth it.

A retreat is not always supposed to be restful. The Lord convicts us of things in the silence. He shakes us. He makes us grow. 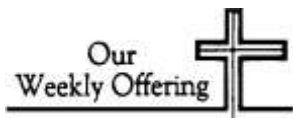

## St. Joseph 150th History Changes in Priests, Structural Changes Are Constant

A state commissioned high school was established during the pastorate of the Rev. John C. Rager at St. Joseph, which began on March 25, 1922. A modern school building and auditorium was also built and formally dedicated in 1925. Fr. Rager also orchestrated interior renovations to the church. He left St. Joseph's in 1936 enroute to a new assignment at St. Mary's Church in Evansville. His replacement was the Rev. Clement M. Zeff, who remained as St. Joseph's pastor until his death on Sept. 28, 1953. An assistant pastor, the Rev. Bernard Burgert assisted him beginning in 1946, and upon Fr. Zeff's death, Fr. Burgert was appointed pastor of St. Joseph.

The church had been completely renovated from 1953-1968. In July 1964 a tape recording device called the "Automated Bell Ringer" was installed because the original bell used since the church dedication in 1908 had become unstable and cracked. Since it became more difficult to find bell ringers, it was decided to purchase the 680 Carillon from the L. T. Viridon Co. The automated system allowed tapes to be set for either automatic or manual playing on a seven-day program cycle. The device had a microphone and four speakers and could also be used for speaking and playing records.

School enrollment continued to increase, so, the school was enlarged. All of the rooms, including those that housed the Sisters, became classrooms. A new parsonage was built, and the old one was turned into a convent.

The year 1968 rounded out more than a century of Catholicism in Shelbyville and a century for St. Joseph's Church. The church grew from the mere 35 families that initially formed the parish to 783 families.

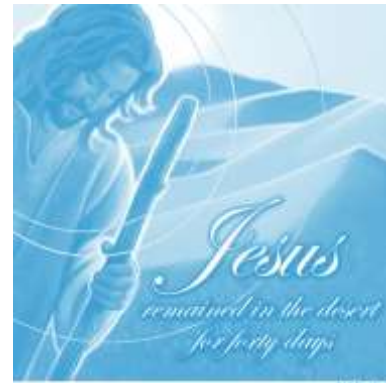

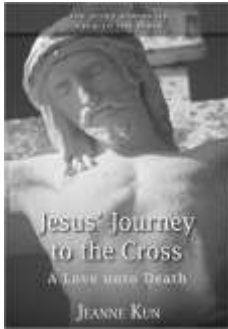
