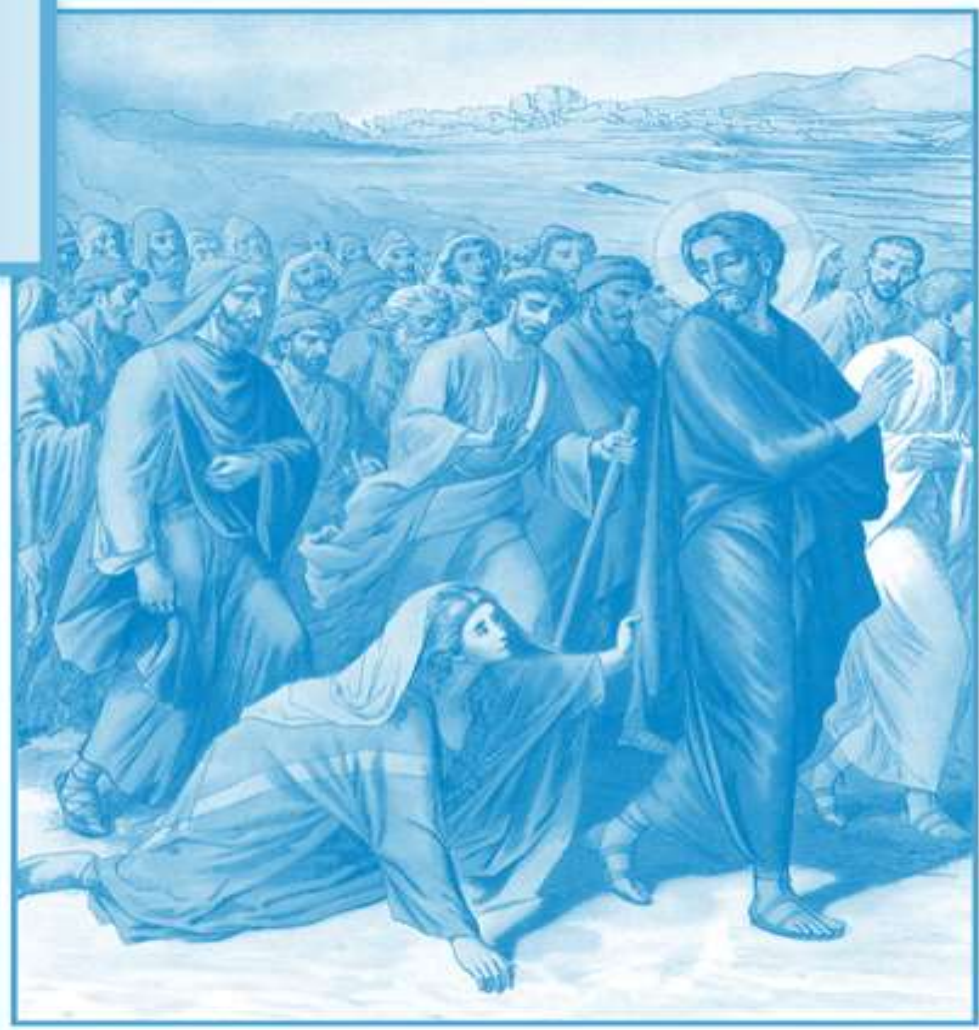

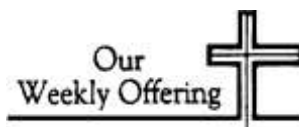

Ask Seminarian Owen Duckett

1. **Question:** Did Jesus really go to Hell? What does the Creed mean when it says, "He descended into Hell"?
2. **Answer:** A proper explanation of the word "hell" as it is used here will help us understand what is meant in the Apostle's Creed. In the Old Testament, hell ("sheol" in Hebrew or "hades" in Greek) referred to a region of darkness for both the good and the bad. A later distinction was made between where the good resided and where the bad were (the latter was named Gehenna, a place of eternal suffering by fire). A great and impassable abyss is said to have been between them. Our Lord Himself attested to this understanding of hell, describing it in the parable of Lazarus and the rich man, Dives. Lazarus dies and is taken to "the land of the dead" (hades in the original Greek text) and is said to be separated from Dives, who is in agony from the flames that awaited him after death.

Holding that thought, we look back in the plan of Salvation History to Adam and Eve, who by way of their fault closed the gates of Heaven. Given that those who died could no longer enjoy the splendor of Paradise, there was need for the redemption of mankind to its original state of union with God. This is where Christ enters the picture of human salvation via His Incarnation. The eventual Sacrifice made by our Lord on the Cross was a timeless one, His Precious Blood was of offered on behalf of all of mankind, past, present, and future. That means that this salvation was also intended for all of those who had died before Christ entered the world.

In essence, the righteous such as Abraham, Moses, Noah, etc. were awaiting their Savior just as much as the rest of the world, though because they had passed on from this life, they waited for Him in the abode of the "good" dead, as described above. Because our Lord actually suffered and actually died a human death, His soul too was separated from His Body at the moment of death. Tradition and Scripture attest that our Lord descended to this to abode of the dead, also known as hell, not to save damned souls or to destroy hell, but to preach the Gospel to the just persons there and to lead the faithful who lived there onto the glory of Heaven, the gates of which were reopened for all of man

kind. This is what is meant then by Christ's descent into hell.

1. **Question:** If Jesus was a Jew, why am I a Christian?
2. **Answer:** To understand this question we have to look at the whole of Salvation History, God's saving plan for all of mankind. It is said in the Scriptures that Christ came "in the fullness of time." This means that our Lord was incarnate and became man at the most opportune and the best appointed time according to the Will of God, which is supreme. The entire Old Testament outlines God's plan for salvation up until the time of our Lord, which included making a covenant with His people. Christ came into the world in the midst of this scene, and seeking to fulfill the old covenant made with Abraham, had to first enter into it. This meant that our Lord was a Jew both ethnically and religiously. Yet, Jesus was the Messiah after all, the one appointed from long ago to save God's people. In our Lord's own words, "do not think that I have come to abolish the Law but to fulfill it."

It is in those last few words that we arrive at the answer as to why you should be Catholic even though our Lord was a Jew. Simply put, the New Covenant that God wanted to establish was not a set of laws, but a Person. At the Last Supper our Lord speaks of establishing the "new covenant in His Blood." Christ is the pinnacle of salvation, and what He speaks is Truth because He is Truth Itself. And so, when Christ clearly mandated the establishment of a Church, a Body, founded by Him on the succession of the Apostles, we ought to heed His words. Our Lord did not come to simply be the most influential rabbi or the best scholar of the law, but to create a New Law in Himself which He then chose to be given to the world by way of His Bride, the Church.

Warning - Spam Email
