From the Desk of Fr. Mike

Dear Friends,

God bless you! This Sunday at the 10:30 am Mass, I must ask your forgiveness for the lack of music during the Mass. This is because I have to get to Greenwood for Confirmation Mass. Two of our own Shelby County youth are getting confirmed there, and Sister Joan, Billy and I want to be there for them. I am also sponsoring two of the OLG youth. That Mass starts at noon.

Our Monday morning Bible study group is going so great. We just started the Book of Revelation. All are welcome. 10 am on Mondays at St. Vincent in the parish hall. "Ignorance of scripture is ignorance of Christ."

In Mass this weekend, we hear Jesus say that it isn't easy to get to Heaven. It takes work to live a good life, a life pleasing to the Lord. But it is worth it! There is nothing better than living as Jesus invites us to live!

I have to tell you I was very sad last weekend because so many of our recently-confirmed youth were not present at any of the Masses. Nothing makes me sadder and feel more like a failure than when people don't go to Mass. It is a sad and horrible thing when something else becomes more important than Sunday Mass. If you have Catholic family and friends that aren't coming to Mass, please try to encourage them. Missing Mass is not a laughing matter; it is a mortal sin (so long as one knows it is wrong and does it anyway). Jesus asks for one hour in the week. One hour! Jesus prepares a banquet and gives his life, his body and blood, for YOU and ME...but we have "something better" to do. Crazy!! Listen to this wisdom I recently heard:

**If it matters to you, you will find a way.
Otherwise you will find an excuse.**

That is good advice for Mass and for all types of things in life, especially in the spiritual life. If God really matters to me, I will find a way to go to church, to proclaim his message, to serve him, to read his word, etc.

Our students are on Fall Break now. High school students are all welcome to the lock-in this Tuesday into Wednesday. We're also going on a March for Life trip. Details inside on these items.

It is the most important thing. At Mass we are in the deepest union with God we can ever be in on this side of heaven. We receive his blood into our veins, his body into ours. We run on God! 40 Days of Life

Intention: May the spirit and example of the Good Samaritan fill the hearts and minds of all citizens.

Scripture: Jesus said: "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, when he fell into the hands of robbers. They stripped him of his clothes, beat him and went away, leaving him half dead. A priest happened to be going down the same road, and when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side. So, too, a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan, as he traveled, came where the man was; and when he saw him, he took pity on him. Which of these three do you think was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?" The expert in the law replied, "The one who had mercy on him." Jesus told him "Go and do likewise." Luke 10:31-37

Reflection: Here Jesus commands us to show mercy to the victims of the culture of violence and death. But why did the priest and Levite fail to show mercy? Perhaps they feared that the robbers were hiding just around the next corner to attack them. They asked themselves, "If I stop to help this man, what will happen to me?" The Samaritan, however, reversed the question, and asked, "If I don't stop to help this man, what will happen to him?" In working to save the unborn, let's not worry about what will happen to us if we act; let's worry about what will happen to the unborn if we don't.
