From the Desk of Fr. Mike

Dear Friends,

Welcome to All Souls Month. This month we pray for our beloved dead. It is a wonderful thing we can do for them. We Catholics should not be afraid to use the word "purgatory." Purgatory is a great gift! It makes sense to have Purgatory, a place for purification, because:

- Heaven is a place of complete perfection
- Many of us won't be perfect when we die
- We need a "place," a way to become perfect to enter the land of perfection

We aren't sure what exactly Purgatory will be like, just as we aren't sure what Heaven or Hell is like. Folks used to talk about the pain of Purgatory. I think the pain comes from knowing that you aren't "there" yet — but it's kind of like the doctor's office waiting room: you know where you're going, but just not sure when.

I pray for my deceased loved ones daily. They were wonderful people on earth, but I don't assume they are in Heaven, because what if they're not?? Instead, I pray for them. And I find that praying for them helps me to be inspired by them all the more.

Remember that I will bless the cemetery and graves of loved ones after the 10:30 a.m. Mass this weekend.

Last weekend I reflected a little about change. Like the leaves, change is not only possible, it is necessary. The tree can't say, "I'm not going to color my leaves this year." Change is also natural, maybe even supernatural. It is a necessary reality. It's a sad thing to find someone who refuses to change. Sometimes we resign ourselves to thinking: this is just the way it is, I can't change. But Jesus says change! And he has organized a world that is always changing to remind us to change. We should always be looking for new ways to pray, new ways to serve God, new ways to serve the parish, new ways to put love into the world, new ways to live! The parish should change as time goes by also, and sometimes the pastor hears complaints when others might see this or that as a negative change! But change is inevitable, and like the leaves, even beautiful.

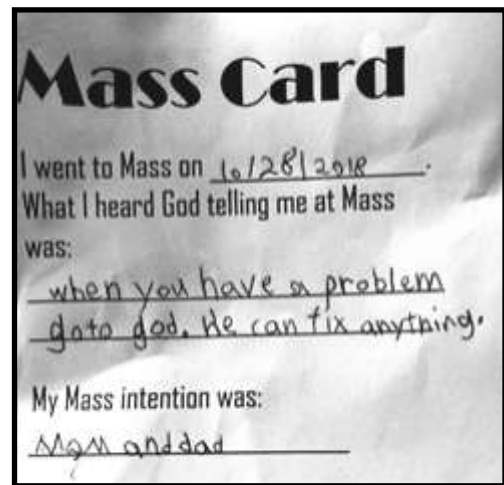
Here's a thought for your week: If you aren't happy now, what are you waiting for?

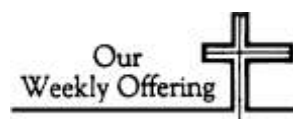
Q. Father Mike, Why do you think Mary appears in so many different forms like Our Lady of Guadalupe and Our Lady of Lourdes?

God's Laws

God's laws are not intended to burden or torment us. Instead they are guideposts that point us in the direction of good living. Accordingly, good living requires loving God and loving one another. We should not follow God's laws out of fear of what might happen if we don't, but rather view them as a foundation for building relationships and trust with one another and with God.

The *Shema* prayer of Orthodox Jews is based on the reading from Deuteronomy today, "Hear, O Israel." Every morning people recite the prayer as a profession of their love for God and pledge their obedience to God throughout the day. They pass on their love of God to their children, from one generation to the next.
