From the Desk of Fr. Mike

Dear Friends,

It is difficult to believe that it is already March. Every year, the entire month of March is dedicated to our patron, St. Joseph. I appreciate many things about St. Joseph. In particular:

- **St. Joseph is a provider.** He built the house Blessed Mother and Jesus lived in. He provided their food. He guided the family on their journeys out of harm's way. Like every good man, St. Joseph provided for his family. And so he continues! You know the phrase, *Ite ad Joseph?* It means, *Go to Joseph.* The phrase itself comes from Genesis 39, which tells the story of the original Joseph, the one with the coat of many colors. He had been sold into slavery and then took charge of all the food during the famine. Whenever anyone needed food, they went to Joseph. Folks! The same is true with St. Joseph. Whenever we need anything, we go to him. I suggest praying in front of his statue here in church after lighting a candle. I hope all his candles are burning throughout this entire month.
- **St. Joseph never says a word in the Bible.** This is an important lesson for many of us. We think we know the best thing, that our ideas are the best, that our words matter more than those of others. St. Joseph teaches us the beauty of being quiet. Of all the qualities that are attractive in a human being, I think humility is the most appealing.
- **St. Joseph was humble and strong.** We often think these two qualities oppose each other, but St. Joseph shows us that's not the case. Instead, they go together. The strongest leader is the humblest leader. I am sure of that.

ITE AD JOSEPH! GO TO JOSEPH!

Lent starts on Wednesday. It is a good idea to prepare for Lent, not to just "let it happen." Pray with Joseph about what you might give up. On Ash Wednesday, we will hear Jesus talking about three things: Prayer, Fasting, and Alms-giving. We should do something in each of these categories. We should do something for prayer, something for fasting/penance (giving something up—make it hard!!), and something for charity. Don't let anyone talk you into an easy Lent.

Q. Someone once told me that there is some kind of list about sins and how we share in the sins of others. Do you know what I might be talking about? I'm trying to remember.

A. I think I know exactly what you're talking about. The list you are talking about has to do with being an accomplice to another's sin, or participating in another's sin. There are nine ways we do this, each one of them wrong. Parents must be extra cautious to never participate in the sins of their children (e.g., their missing Mass, bad habits, etc.). Here is the list of ways we sin ourselves by participating in the sin of another:

1. by counsel/advice
2. by command
3. by consent
4. by provocation
5. by praise or flattery
6. by concealment
7. by partaking
8. by silence
9. by the defense of the ill done

A. Oh no, it's never too late to join! Right now, we are working through the Gospel of John. We started two weeks ago and haven't finished the first chapter yet. It runs deep! We will probably be on John for a while. Come as you can. Just bring a Bible and a heart eager to dig into God's word.

Sr. Joan's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

In this Sunday's Gospel reading, Jesus says that every tree is known by its fruit. You can tell the difference between a good tree and a rotten tree by their fruit. Jesus is really talking about us. What fruits is Jesus talking about? I believe he is talking about the "Fruits of the Holy Spirit." Every person has the seeds of the Fruits of the Holy Spirit within them. The Catholic Church lists these twelve: Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Long-suffering. These have to do with our relationship with God. If you are in right relationship with God you have Love, Joy and Peace within you. In that loving relationship you can also bear better the troubles of this life, and so patience and long-suffering are on this list.

The next four have to do with your attitude towards your neighbor: Goodness, Generosity, Gentleness and Faithfulness. When you are inclined to wish good for your neighbor, you have goodness; when you are inclined to actually help your neighbor, you have generosity. You have mildness when you put up with a troublesome neighbor and you have faithfulness when you are reliable and trustworthy.

Finally the last three fruits are: Modesty, Self-control and Chastity and have to do with your attitude about yourself. You have modesty when you are inclined to be content even if you are not the center of attention. You have self-control if you are inclined to discipline yourself with regard to morally acceptable things. And you have chastity if you are inclined to discipline yourself about those things that tempt you but are not morally acceptable.

This week as you pray and prepare for Lent, talk to God about which one or two of these fruits you need to cultivate in your life to become a better "tree" or person.

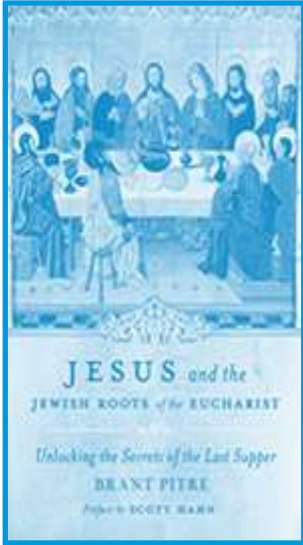

He knows that we have an uncanny ability to be blind to our own weaknesses, though they be as big as a board. He knows, too, how willingly we seem to ferret out others' smallest speck-like flaws. And this, too, is for our general consumption; solid old goodness and solid old badness will show eventually. The old Latin saying, which echoes Jesus' images, is true: "What is bred in the bone will out in the flesh." By and by, the inside will show through.
