

## From the Desk of Fr. Mike

Dear Parishioners,

"Rebuild my Church," said Jesus to St. Francis of Assisi. Here are six ways we're doing that on a local level....

### **1. Supporting the Formation of Good Priests:**

This weekend we welcome Fr. Harry Hagan, OSB, a monk of St. Meinrad. As you know from my homilies, I attended the seminary there -- six of the happiest years of my life. Deacon Tom received his formation there, and Seminarian Jose is a current student there. I'll let Fr. Harry tell you all about the place and the work they do to, but I must tell you that St. Meinrad is near and dear to my heart. I wouldn't trade my years at that place for anything. Fr. Harry was one of my Scripture professors when I was in seminary. I'll need to review my transcripts to see, but I think I managed to pull out all A's from him!! We are invited to help support the work of St. Meinrad. There are lots of major (post college) seminaries out there, but St. Meinrad is the best.

**2. Adoration Chapel/Archbishop Visit:** Our Perpetual Adoration Chapel opens on June 23, 2019 at 3pm!!! I can hardly wait. Archbishop Thompson is coming to dedicate/bless the chapel at that time. A good showing would be awesome -- please come if you can! It's not too late to sign up for an hour.

**3. New SVDP Store:** The new SVDP store (located at 425 E Washington St) will open for business on July 13, 2019. God is doing such great things through SVDP. Look what He has done in ONE YEAR! Thanks for your support.

**4. New Faith Formation Programs Coming:** Billy and I have been working hard on redesigning our faith formation programs for non-SJ school kids. Family Faith Formation turned out not to be the success we wanted it to be. If you'd like to be a catechist, let us know. More details to come about what the changes will look like.

**5. School Construction:** Construction work began this past week on the "new" side of the school building, the side that was built in 1952. Using the monies from the Reverse Raffle, all ceilings, floors, pipes, and furniture are being replaced this summer. Work is also being done in the hallways and stairwells. What a blessing.

**6. Cemetery Drive:** I want to update you on the St. Joseph Cemetery. You may remember that several months ago, we hosted a couple workdays at the cemetery. What turned out to be quite a large group of us painted the fence, trimmed a ton of bushes, scrubbed the priest graves, and took

care of all types of things. The cemetery looks one thousand times better.

That said, our cemetery work isn't done. What we need to do now is repave the drive. The current drive is quite bumpy and the drive is broken in many places. It has been a long time. Last year, Bruce and Edna Knecht patched the huge pothole, but something more is needed. With Bruce and Edna spearheading this project, we are endeavoring to raise about \$30,000 to repave the drive. That's a pretty good quote, and it includes a 1" binder and 1" topping, which would prevent the cracking problem we have now. This drive will last for many, many years.

Some wonder why we can't just pay for this out of cemetery account. We have an endowment for our cemetery with about \$125,000 in it, and this endowment spits out about \$5,000 in interest each year. That pays for only a portion of the maintenance, but not all of it. The rest is covered by general operating monies.

One of the Corporal Works of Mercy is to bury the dead. We are blessed at both St. Joseph and St. Vincent to have cemeteries, and many of our loved ones are buried there. We owe it to our ancestors -- and to those who will come after us -- to take good care of our cemeteries.

So far, we have about 2/3 of this money already pledged. Folks have donated anywhere from \$25 to \$5000. If you would like to donate to this project, please contact Rebecca Makowski in the parish office. Call Bruce and Edna with any questions. I thank them for taking up this project. We need to take care of our cemetery. We hope this project will be done by All Souls Day -- November 2.

### Sr. Joan's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Trinity and Father's Day. In some ways they are both a mystery because they both include relationships. Fathers are fathers because they have a family. Most fathers give their love and their lives for their children. Most children love their fathers. Relationships are dynamic, with a lot of give and take.

When we think of the Blessed Trinity, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit there is also a relationship among the three. There is an icon created by a Russian iconographer Andrei Rublev named *The Trinity*. On that icon there are 3 persons sitting at a table. One is dressed in gold the color of the Father—perfection, fullness, wholeness, the ultimate Source. One is dressed in blue the color of the Human—God in Christ taking on humanity. This figure holds up two fingers to tell us that he has put divinity and humanity together within himself. The third figure is dressed in green showing the quality of divine aliveness that makes everything blossom. They are looking at each other. One can tell that they are in relationship. The most important thing about the icon is that there is an empty place at the table. This place is for you. You are included in this relationship. Just think about it: You are included in the intimate relationship of the Blessed Trinity! It sounds too good to be true, but believe it. This week as you pray, carry on a conversation with this loving God that will always include you in this relationship. We are welcome at this table.



## This is the Holy Trinity

Today we celebrate the Holy Trinity, one of the most confounding mysteries of our faith. Through this mystery we experience our relationship to God: Creator, Savior, and Holy Spirit. This relationship is not easy to understand or to describe. It does not become clearer through analysis. Its complexity mirrors the complexity of all our relationships. We understand our relationships with our spouses, our children, our parents, and our friends only through daily give-and-take, annual rituals, and the life-changing moments we share. We understand our relationships only as we live them. The relationships we have with those we love, and who love us, sustain us through an uncertain and difficult life. This is the Holy Trinity. What is striking about today's readings is that each is incomplete. What they do offer is a description of a moment in our relationship, a memory of a time and an event when our relationship made sense even though that sense may be beyond our ability to describe fully. Often that is all that our faith offers, that is, a memory of what is possible, what is promised, what has been given. A memory of eternity, of love beyond understanding is to be cherished and nurtured even if not fully understood. This is the Holy Trinity.
