From the Desk of Fr. Mike

Dear Friends,

Today is a monumental day in the life of our parish! Today, we become the 14th parish in the Archdiocese of Indianapolis to have a perpetual adoration chapel. I cannot express to you how happy this makes me. Surely heaven is rejoicing today. It's a joy to welcome Archbishop with us today for the dedication. Please come back at 2:15 p.m. for the Corpus Christi procession and then the chapel blessing at 3:00 p.m., followed by food and fellowship.

I just got back from the annual priest gathering. I had the joy of sitting with Fr. Fink at the dinner where he was honored for his 50th anniversary. I got to thinking: one day, it will be my 50th, should I live that long. No matter what I ever do in my priestly life from here on out, nothing will hold a candle to opening this adoration chapel. It is the best thing a priest can ever do for his parish, except to offer the sacraments.

I say that in all humility, because I don't pretend for a minute that I did this alone. For one thing, many priests before me have dreamed this and paved the way. I especially think of Fr. Aaron, who thanked me for helping his dream come true. Fr. Rodriguez also wanted this so badly and was so excited when I told him. They wish they could be with us today and send their regrets.

The chapel is also the fruit of so many parishioners who have made it happen. Angelica Tellez, for example, has prayed for this chapel every day for ten years. Jim Kozinski is a new parishioner, who showed up less than a year ago and asked about adoration. We both believe God sent him here to bring this to fruition. Bryan and Celeste Fischer, Gaye McKenney, the Piddlers, and several others have worked so hard to prepare the space.

And you! All of you who have taken hours: THANK YOU!! I can't believe that almost every hour was taken after ONE WEEKEND, and that almost all of the hours have multiple people. I still don't understand why I don't see some people's names on the schedule....Yes, I noticed:) One of the best things we can ever do is to be available to God.

Now, I feel a little guilty because I have to miss the first week of the chapel! Seminarian Jose will be taking all my hours this first week, bless his soul. (Jose is doing an AMAZING job this summer...I am blown away by how wonderful he is! He will be an amazing priest.)

The reason I have to be away is that I'm going with a priest friend to Guatemala. I love

Guatemala and have been there a handful of times. It is where I learned Spanish. I remember being super excited when, after having been at St. Joe almost a full year, I discovered a poster with some information about our sister parish in Guatemala on it. I didn't even know we had a sister parish.

Our sister parish is called Our Lady of Guadalupe and it is located in Chel, which is in the Quiche Department. (In Guatemala, they don't have states; instead, they have departments. Same thing.) The current priest there is Fr. Fransisco. They get a new pastor every year, which surprised me until I learned that the one priest there has not only the main parish to worry about, but also 27 mini-parishes. Can you imagine? I can't! I'm not sure how he manages it all. Some of those little parishes are the size of a big shed, and others are as big as St. Vincent. None are remotely as fancy as our churches here in Shelby Co. Those little chapels are lucky to get a Mass every few months.

They need a lot of help. They operate a school, as I noted, and the teachers make about \$1000 per year. That is a lot for them. As part of our charitable outreach, St. Joseph will be making a nice donation to the parish. As you can imagine, they need a lot of help.

It is good to have a sister parish because it reminds us that we are all connected. We are bigger than just "us," just "here." That is also the beauty of belonging to a diocese, which is able to do so much more than a single parish ever could, and having priests and nuns come from "out there" to ask our help.

Speaking of that, next weekend, while I am still on the mission trip, we will welcome a priest from Unbound. This is a Catholic organization that allows you to "adopt" a child from a third world country. You write back and forth a few times each year (Unbound does the translating, but you get the original letter with the typed translation), and they send you pictures. It's \$33/month to sponsor a kid. I sponsor a young man in Guatemala. We write each other and pray for each other daily. This is an incredible opportunity to make a difference in a young person's life--and you get to see and know exactly who you're helping. Unbound is a wonderful organization. You can trust them. I have for years.

Anyhow, go to the chapel and enjoy it! Say some prayers for me as I go to our sister parish on mission. I'll let you know all about the trip when I get back.


