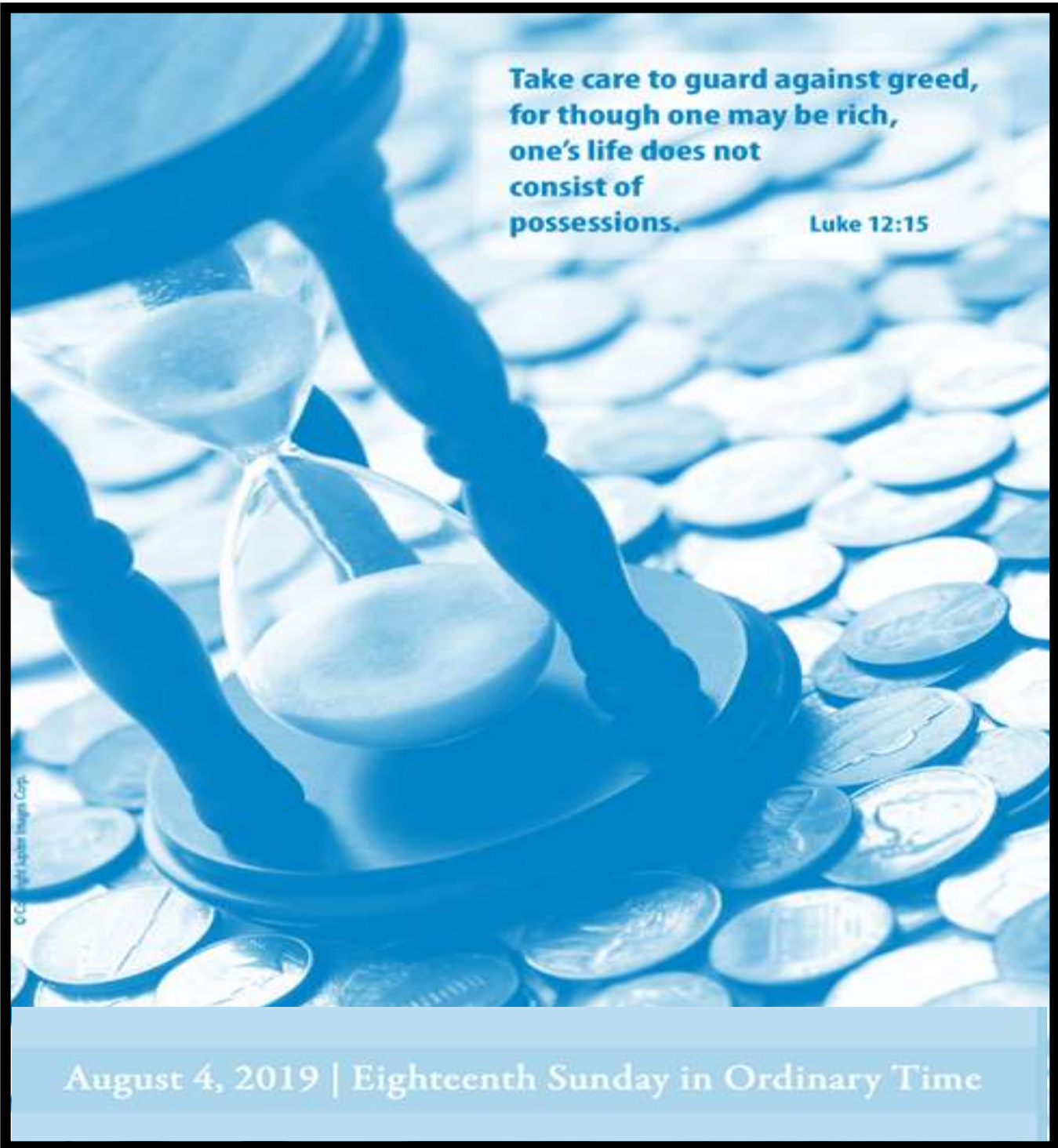

## From the Desk of Fr. Mike

Dear Friends,

Today, August 4, is the feast day of Saint John Vianney. I have a relic of his that I will take to all the Masses. Fr. John was a humble little priest in France. During his seminary days, he could not master Latin, philosophy, or theology, so the bishop almost didn't ordain him. But a friend of the bishop, who knew some relative of the young aspiring priest, prevailed upon the dear bishop. Reluctantly, the bishop agreed, but on one condition: Fr. John would be assigned to Ars, a tiny little town, where his "stupidity" wouldn't cause too many problems. The bishop assigned him there and never expected what would happen.

Turned out that Fr. Vianney was quite a success as a priest, despite his lack of competency in the fancies of the priestly trade. Today he is the saint we priests call our patron and look to for example. They ended up having to build train tracks to Ars, so great was the multitude of people who sought his wisdom. He spent endless hours in the confessional every day. He gave catechisms and people came from all over the place. He fasted and prayed as much as, if not more than the early desert fathers.

I have his relic and picture in the rectory chapel. I look to him all the time for wisdom and guidance. I also pray to him for many more good and holy priests.

It is hard to imagine how much God used this simple, humble apparent nobody of a priest. If God can do such great things through him, there is no doubt he can do the same through any of us. We simply need to cooperate. It's pretty great: God accomplishes what he accomplishes in spite of us -- and *because* of us.

I had the grace to celebrate Mass in front of Fr. Vianney's body a year ago when I led a pilgrimage to France. I got to use his chalice. I still get goosebumps thinking about it.

We must pray daily for more good and holy priests. We should talk about it with the young men we know because it is possible -- and certain -- that God is calling some young men in our own midst to the priesthood. It takes courage to follow God's call, and they certainly need our support. And they need us to nurture their vocations.
